SUZUKA 10 HOURS ENDURANCE RACE 2018 Technical Regulations

T1. Definition of Minimum Weight

Minimum Weight is the weight of a car without fuel. No person, luggage, tools or jack should be included. Optional reservoirs, including liquid tanks (such as lubricant, coolant, brake oil, heater) must be filled up to the level specified by the manufacturer.

Cars must meet the following conditions.

- a) Official onboard camera and equipment are included in the Minimum Weight.
- b) Driver's drinking water is not included.

T2.1 Cars participating in the Intercontinental GT Challenge (FIA-GT3) must be in compliance with the following additional regulations in the Appendix J - Article 257A of the 2017 FIA International Motorsports Sporting Code.

- 6.3) Fuel Tanks
- 10.2) Springs and Shock Absorbers
- 14.2) Safety belts/harnesses
- 15.1) Safety cage

T2.2 Cars participating in the Intercontinental GT Challenge (FIA-GT3) and were authorized after January 1st, 2016 must be in compliance with the following additional regulations in the Appendix J - Article 257A of the 2017 FIA International Motorsports Sporting Code.

- 14.4) Seats and headrest
- 14.7) Lifting device
- 14.8) Roof hatch for access to the cockpit







T3.1 Cars participating in the Super GT and Super Endurance (JAF-GT300, JAF-GT300MC) must be in compliance with the following additional regulations in Chapter 7 of the 2018 JAF domestic motorsports technical regulations.

T3.2 Cars participating in the Super GT and Super Endurance (JAF-GT300, JAF-GT300MC) and are new models manufactured in 2018 or later must be in compliance with the following additional regulations in Chapter 7 of the 2018 JAF domestic motorsports technical regulations.

- 3.3.3.3) Ceiling opening
- 12.3) Seats and headrest
- 12.10) Driver rescue opening
- 13.3) Lifting device
